

CLERY ACT COMPLIANCE FOR ON CAMPUS YOUTH PROGRAMS

(University of Southern California)

The Clery Act

The “Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998,” commonly referred to as the “Clery Act,” requires institutions of higher education receiving federal financial aid to report specified crime statistics on college campuses and areas within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of college campuses and to provide other safety and crime information to members of the campus community.

Who is Required to Report?

Campus Security Authority (CSA)

Because of your role with the university, you have been designated as a Campus Security Authority (CSA). As a CSA, you are required to report Clery Act Crimes that you observe or that are reported to you, which take place within the University’s Clery Geography.

Clery-Reportable Crimes

Clery Act Crimes: murder/non-negligent manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, sex offenses (rape, fondling, statutory rape, and incest), robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, arson, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking as well as crimes motivated by bias.

USC Clery Act Geography includes the following:

On-Campus (*University Park Campus, Health Sciences Campus, Alhambra Campus, Aviation Safety Campus, Catalina Campus, LAC+USC Campus, Marina Del Rey Campus, Orange County Center-Irvine, USC State Capitol Center-Sacramento, San Diego Campus*)

Public Property (*Owned by a public entity (Federal, State, Local government) and within or immediately adjacent to campus*)

Non-Campus (*Owned or controlled by the University, a university recognized student organization or institution associated entity including off-campus fraternities and university buildings*)

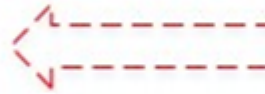
How to Report?

Crime Alert/Timely Warnings

In an effort to provide timely notice to the campus community in the event of a Clery Act crime that may pose a serious or ongoing threat to members of the community, the Department of Public Safety (DPS) issues "Crime Alert/Timely Warnings." The University may issue a Crime Alert/Timely Warning for Clery-Reportable crimes that may pose a continuing threat to the campus community. DPS will distribute these warnings through a variety of ways, including but not limited to emails, posters and media. The University also has the ability to send text message alerts to those who register their cell phone numbers.
